

Title: Evaluation of the GAVI Alliance

A consortium led by CEPA, including Applied Strategies (US) and several subject matter experts from the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine and other affiliations, has been appointed to carry out the second evaluation of GAVI.

Launched in 2000, the GAVI Alliance is a global health partnership representing stakeholders in immunisation from both private and public sectors including developing world and donor governments, private sector philanthropists such as the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, the financial community, developed and developing country vaccine manufacturers, research and technical institutes, civil society organisations and multilateral organisations like WHO, UNICEF and the World Bank. The mission of GAVI is to save children's lives and protect people's health by increasing access to immunisation in poor countries.

The evaluation will assess GAVI's performance since inception, but with particular focus on the period between 2006 to present. The focus of the evaluation is on two key questions, namely:

- To what extent has the GAVI Alliance met its four strategic goals?
- To what extent has the Alliance added value at the global and country levels, over and above what would be accomplished without the Alliance?

The evaluation will be based on extensive desk based review of relevant documentation, quantitative analysis including regression analysis, structured interviews, electronic survey and country visits to select GAVI eligible countries.
