

Developing a best practise guide for the Private Infrastructure Development Group (PIDG)

Since its creation in 2002, the PIDG has been involved in the establishment of a number of facilities designed to help facilitate private sector participation in the delivery of infrastructure services in low income countries, as a means to accelerate poverty reduction through economic growth. The PIDG considers its approach for establishing and managing its facilities as distinctive from other similar PPP approaches on a number of levels, including using a flexible approach to determine what type of intervention is required, and bringing in private sector expertise and capital in the design and funding of the facilities themselves. The PIDG members are keen that the knowledge and lessons learned from establishing and managing their various facilities are documented and disseminated broadly as a means of encouraging best practice in the field of private sector participation in infrastructure.

Towards this end, CEPA is developing a best practise guide on the PIDG approach, highlighting the benefits as well as challenges faced. The development of the report involves extensive consultations with various stakeholders of the PIDG including the donor members, PIDG facility managers, users of PIDG projects and the wider stakeholder community.
